## Australian Development Scholarships (ADS)

ADS is a scholarship program developed to allow eligible successful applicants to undertake Master's degree studies at selected Australian universities. The scholarships are for study and include a living allowance. There are two categories for the program: Category 1 (Targeted Institutions) and Category 2 (Targeted Fields of Study).



### Who is eligible for a scholarship?

Individuals who either have been employed by a targeted ministry or associated agency for more than two years (Category 1), or an individual who has more than two years work experience and who wishes to study in one of the targeted study areas (Category 2) are invited to apply. These individuals must also meet eligibility criteria listed on the MASP website [www.masp.mn](http://www.masp.mn).

## Category 1 – Targeted Institutions

21 scholarships are available under Category 1 for core staff and staff of the associated agencies of the:

- Cabinet Secretariat
- Civil Service Council
- Ministry of Education, Culture and Science
- Ministry of Food, Agriculture and Light Industry
- Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade
- Ministry of Health
- Ministry of Defence
- Ministry of Roads, Transportation, Construction and Urban Development
- Ministry of Justice and Home Affairs
- Ministry of Finance
- Ministry of Mineral Resources and Energy
- Ministry of Nature, Environment and Tourism
- Ministry of Social Welfare and Labour
- President's Office
- Parliament
- Supreme Court
- Prime Minister's Office
- Deputy PM's Office
- First Deputy PM's Office

The scholarships will be awarded according to skills needs identified in ministry human resource development plans.

### How are Applicants selected?

Eligible candidates for each category will be selected according to the criteria listed on the Mongolia – Australia Scholarship Program website [www.masp.mn](http://www.masp.mn).

The ranking and selection of applicants under Category 1 will be made by a four person Panel comprising members of the Ministry's Working Group (PAMD) and a representative from MASP.

The ranking and selection of applicants under Category 2 will be undertaken by a four person Panel comprising an Academic Adviser, a representative from the Association of Employers (for the private sector), a representative from the NGO Council (for civil society), and AusAID.



## Category 2 – Targeted Fields of Study

17 scholarships are available under Category 2, on a competitive basis, for Master's Programs covering the following targeted fields of study:

Mining/Mining Engineering, Construction Engineering, Energy and Natural Resources Law, Resource Economics, Renewable Energy, Coal Technology, Nanotechnology, Biotechnology, Environmental Studies relating to Resource Development, Agricultural Economics and/or Marketing, Infectious Plant Diseases, Pasture Management, Actuarial Studies, Non-Bank Financial Regulation, Epidemiology and public Health, Reproductive Health, Gender and Women's Development Studies, Human Rights, Teaching English to Speakers of Other Languages.
